The International Journal of Housing Policy is celebrating its 25th anniversary, and together with the UK Centre for Collaborative Housing Evidence (CaCHE) is hosting a symposium on *Reflections and Developments in Housing Research: What's Next?* The seminar will situate its retrospective insights with an eye of the future direction of research. Housing scholars are invited to submit short abstracts of papers (max 250 words) for the conference by 30 April.

Abstracts may address a wide range of themes, including (but not limited to):

- New/ ongoing drivers: climate change, digitalisation, AI, populism
- Housing governance: role of government in changing world
- Policy transfer
- Methodological developments
- Global North and South
